

DOMAINE HENRY NATTER

SANCERRE ROUGE



GROWING REGION:

Sancerre, Loire Valley, France.

TERROIR:

From 10 acres in Montigny, a village in the southwestern zone of the Sancerre appellation. Soils are Kimmeridgian marls, the chalky limestone that makes for immensely characterful, lifted wines.

GRAPES:

Pinot Noir.

VINIFICATION NOTES:

Alcoholic fermentation in tank and then the wine is racked into barrels, mostly older wood, for 18 months of aging.

TASTING NOTES:

Complex and fruity with substantial mineral and earth aromas. This makes a great alternative to red Burgundy (indeed, Sancerre was once the western boundary of the Duchy of Burgundy, and Pinot Noir has long been grown here).
