Willamette Valley Pinot Noir 2018

Pale ruby, the 2018 Pinot Noir Willamette Valley has a nose of red and black berries with wafts of licorice and dried flowers. The palate is light-bodied, soft and juicy with a fine balance of bright berry fruit and earthy accents, and it finishes long and perfumed.

Temperance Hill Vineyard Pinot Noir, Eola-Amity Hills 2018

Pale ruby, the 2018 Pinot Noir Temperance Hill is layered and savory, with pure tobacco and Earl Grey tea leaves, licorice and bright red berries on the nose. The palate is soft, seamlessly fresh and delicately styled, offering an array of pure spicy flavors and a very long, uplifted finish.

Whistling Ridge Vineyard Pinot Noir, Ribbon Ridge 2018

The 2018 Pinot Noir Whistling Ridge Vineyard has a pale ruby color with a lovely perfume of mint leaves, crushed black cherries and turned earth with an iron-like streak. The medium-bodied palate is grainy and fresh with a fine balance of intense, dark fruits and earthy accents, and it finishes long and flavorful.

Fir Crest Vineyard Pinot Noir, Yamhill-Carlton 2018

Pale ruby-purple, the 2018 Pinot Noir Fir Crest Vineyard offers alluring blood orange and cranberries on the nose with accents of cured meats, tobacco leaves and aniseed. The medium-bodied palate is soft, juicy and savory with loads of detailed flavors and a very long, very spicy finish.

Whistling Ridge Vineyard “Richard’s Cuvée” Chardonnay, Ribbon Ridge 2018

The 2018 Chardonnay Richard's Cuvée Whistling Ridge Vineyard is slow to open, and worth the wait. It begins with crushed filberts, flint and citrus peel that give way to generous, spicy orchard fruits. The palate is stunning, with a satiny texture and ethereal quality that belies its pure fruit intensity. It has seamlessly integrated acidity and a finish that never seems to end.
