Châteauneuf-du-Pape 2017

Lots of spice, cedar, sappy flowers, and sweet red fruits emerge from the 2017 Châteauneuf Du Pape, which is a Grenache-dominated blend that includes small amounts of Syrah, Mourvèdre, and Clairette. Brought up all in foudre, it's perfumed, elegant, medium-bodied, and nicely balanced on the palate. It's not a blockbuster, but it shines for its elegance and complexity. The blend is 80% Grenache, 7% Syrah, 5% Mourvèdre, and the rest a mix of varieties, mostly from pebbly soils, brought up all in foudre.

Châteauneuf-du-Pape “1600” 2017

The silky, Counoise-majority 2017 Chateauneuf du Pape 1600 has evolved nicely since last year, delivering black cherries accented by hints of dark chocolate and garrigue. Thanks to its varietal makeup, it remains atypically crisp and vibrant, with silky tannins and a long, mouthwatering finish. It should drink well for a decade.

Châteauneuf-du-Pape “Marquis Anselme Mathieu” 2017

The 2017 Châteauneuf Du Pape Marquis Anselme Mathieu has slightly more richness and depth, showing notes of smoked black cherries, raspberries, spring flowers, and scorched earth. Hitting the palate with medium to full-bodied richness, nicely integrated acidity, and fine tannins. it's another rich yet elegant wine that's going to evolve for a solid 10-15 years.
