

Domaine Serrigny Savigny-les-Beaune



Bourgogne Aligoté 2020



These aligoté vines are located in the village of Savigny and Madame Serrigny noted that “these are the oldest vines in all of Savigny-les-Beaune.” She continued, “they are more than one hundred years old and not very productive anymore, but I would never think of replanting, as one has to respect them and all that they have been through.” They have produced a superb wine in 2020, offering up a deep and complex nose of apple, pear, a touch of iodine, chalky soil tones and a topnote of spring flowers. On the palate the wine

is deep, full-bodied, crisp and complex, with a great core from the old vines, superb soil inflection and grip and a long, zesty and well-balanced finish. This is one of the best examples of aligoté I have ever tasted! 2023-2035.

Savigny-les-Beaune Blanc 2020



The 2020 Savigny-les-Beaune Blanc from Domaine Serrigny is also excellent. The wine is made entirely from chardonnay and is bright and nicely mineral in personality for this drought-stricken vintage. The wine is raised in thirty percent new oak and delivers a refined aromatic constellation of quince, green apple, a complex base of chalky soil tones, a touch of iodine, apple blossoms and vanillin oak. On the palate the wine is bright, full-bodied and zesty, with a lovely core of fruit, good soil undertow and grip, fine acids and a long,

complex and beautifully balanced finish. Good juice that could do with a year or two in the cellar to let it fully blossom. 2024-2040.
