Dolcettto d'Alba 2021

The Nada family's 2021 Dolcetto d'Alba is a ripe and sappy example of this underrated varietal. The bouquet hops from the glass in a mix of sweet dark berries, black cherries, cigar smoke, dark soil tones, a touch of peanut and a topnote of violets. On the palate the wine is deep, full-bodied and has a bit of tannin on the backend, with a sappy core of fruit, good soil undertow and grip and a long, complex finish. I know very few people are going to cellar a 2021 Dolcetto, but at least decant this wine for twenty or thirty minutes before serving it young, just to let its tannins soften up a bit. Good juice. 2023-2030.
