

# Domaine de la Roche Bleue Jasnières



## Jasnières “Le Clos des Molières” 2019

*The 2019 Jasnières “le Clos des Molières” from Domaine de la Roche Bleue is Sébastien’s single vineyard bottling, from one of the most prized lieux à dits in the appellation. The 2019 version is done in a Demi-Sec style and offers up a refined aromatic constellation of sweet quince, fresh pineapple, lanolin, a hint of honeycomb, a beautiful base of chalky minerality, fruit blossoms and citrus peel. On the palate the wine is pure, full-bodied, focused and gently sweet, with excellent depth at the core, fine balance, a lovely spine of acidity and a very long, complex and classy finish. This is an outstanding wine that is already very tasty, but will age long and gracefully as well. Most impressive. 2023-2055.*

## Jasnières “Le Clos des Molières” 2017

*The 7ha Domaine de la Roche Bleue is run by Sébastien Cornille, who is originally from near Sancerre, Cornille bought the vines in 2009 in Marçon: 2.65ha in Jasnières and the rest in Coteaux du Loir. The Clos des Molières is one of the best sites in the small appellation of Jasnières, and these 15-year-old vines are planted on flinty clay. The grapes are picked by hand with a yield of 30 hl/ha. The wine is fermented and matured in a mix of acacia and oak barrels for eight months. The 2017 has very attractive honeyed and citric aromas, with mouthfilling, quite rich fruits leading to a lovely precision of fairly austere acidity on the long finish. 2019-2032.*
