

Monts de Berru Statistics 2023

- Nogent l'Abbesse: south side of mountain, 170 hectares of vines, 110 growers, 2 of whom are RMs (Champagnes Laborde and Warnet)
- Berru: north side of mountain, 100 hectares, 50 growers, 1 RM (Champagne Jacques Picard)
- Cernay-lès-Reims: west side of mountain, 80 hectares, 50 growers, no RMs.

Most growers are Recoltants-Coopérateurs and sell their fruit to the two local co-ops, who in turn supply the big houses (above all, Laurent-Perrier, Roederer, Veuve Clicquot and Pommery). Some twenty of these growers elect to take their wine back from the co-op as finished bottles, which they then sell.

Note that in terms of modern Champagne zones, Mont de Berru consisted of the three villages that anchored the mountain: Berru, Cernay-lès-Reims and Nogent l'Abbesse. In the 1960s, it became plural—*Monts* de Berru—when the administrative area expanded thanks to the power of Moët & Chandon, which obtained rights to plant 20 hectares in Pontfaverger-Morovilliers and Selles to the northeast. Among the cognoscenti, however, those 20 hectares are outliers.
