



DIVISION-VILLAGES GAMAY NOIR LES PETITS FERS

Inspired by the vibrant *vins de soif* of the Loire, the urban winery of Division makes approachable and balanced wines through minimal manipulation. Kate Norris and Tom Monroe work with well-farmed, terroir-expressive vineyards, many of which are organic and/or biodynamic, making a bevy of wine in small batches with a focus on lovely, pure aromatics and their sheer drinkability and ease. These wines are nothing if not comfortable in their own skin.



VINEYARD

- Site:** Mostly from Willamette Valley but also from one vineyard in the Columbia Valley.
- Soil:** Iron-rich volcanic soils.
- Vines:** Farmed with a focus on sustainability.
- Varieties:** Gamay Noir.

CELLAR

- Vinification & Aging:** Carbonic and semi-carbonic maceration using significant amounts of whole cluster except for the Columbia Valley Gamay which was mostly destemmed and fermented spontaneously in an open-top vat. The lots aged independently in mostly concrete tanks, stainless steel tanks, and some neutral barrels for six months.
- Production:** ~525 cases.
- Profile:** Savory character with a deep mineral core. Red fruitiness and peppery characteristics typical of Gamay.
