



DIVISION PINOT NOIR UN

Inspired by the vibrant *vins de soif* of the Loire, the urban winery of Division makes approachable and balanced wines through minimal manipulation. Kate Norris and Tom Monroe work with well-farmed, terroir-expressive vineyards, many of which are organic and/or biodynamic, making a bevy of wine in small batches with a focus on lovely, pure aromatics and their sheer drinkability and ease. These wines are nothing if not comfortable in their own skin.



VINEYARD

- Site:** Willamette Valley: Cassin Vineyard, Jubilee Vineyard, Armstrong Vineyard, Johan Vineyard, Eola Springs Vineyard and Temperance Hill Vineyard.
- Soil:** Majority of fruit grown in volcanic soils with some from marine sedimentary.
- Vines:** Organic farmed.
- Varieties:** Pinot Noir.

CELLAR

- Vinification & Aging:** The separate Pinot Noir lots were fermented either spontaneously or via a *pied de cuve* build up to provide more spice, nuance and nerve to the wine. Aged eight months in French oak barrels and puncheons and the two months in concrete.
- Production:** ~1,800 cases.
- Profile:** A vintage-character wine in a lighter, finesse-driven style. Balanced and nuanced.
