



LES PARCELLAIRES DE SAULX ALOXE-CORTON

1ER CRU LES FOURNIÈRES

Les Parcellaires de Saulx is a small *maison de vins* going back to 1908. Isabelle Laurand is the cellarmaster; she is a native Burgundian who has held the position since the turn of the century. The house has a strict focus on single-vineyard wines from single producers, and works predominantly with organic or biodynamic growers. Every wine is raised in predominantly older wood to let a particular site's fruit and soil notes shine; for most of the wines, only a single barrel is made.



VINEYARD

- Site:** This vineyard lies under the grand cru of Corton Les Perrières and faces east. The name *Fournières* refers to crude stoves used to burn the wood from fields being cleared.
- Soil:** Relatively deep clay-limestone soils.
- Vines:** Old: planted in the mid-1980s.
- Varieties:** Pinot Noir.

CELLAR

- Vinification & Aging:** Native ferments followed by an *élevage* of 12-15 months in barrel, mostly old.
- Production:** ~2 barrels or 100/ 6-packs in a normal year.
- Profile:** Terrific fruit here with real breadth and depth.
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
