Bourgogne Blanc 2022

The 2022 Bourgogne Blanc from Domaine Serrigny is another very good example of its level and its vintage. As I have mentioned in the past, most of these vines lie in the commune of Meursault and this shows on the lovely nose, as it offers up scents of apple, pear, almond, chalky soil tones, spring flowers and a deft touch of vanillin oak. On the palate the wine is pure, precise and full, with a good core of fruit, lovely acids and grip and a long, young and well-balanced finish. This is fine bottle of Bourgogne Blanc in the making, but it will really want a couple of years in the cellar to blossom. 2027-2040.

Bourgogne Aligoté 2022

Marie-Laure Serrigny's Aligoté is produced from ancient vines, now more than a hundred years of age, planted in the commune of Savigny-lès-Beaune. Her 2022 version is lovely, offering up a deep and nicely ripe bouquet of pear, apple, chalky soil tones and a topnote of lime blossoms. On the palate the wine is bright, full-bodied, complex and very nicely balanced, with a good core of fruit, zesty acids and good length and grip on the well balanced finish. Fine juice. 2025-2035.

Savigny-les-Beaune Blanc 2022

The 2022 Savigny-lès-Beaune Blanc from Domaine Serrigny is a lovely bottle of chardonnay in the making. The wine is fairly reserved in profile today, but with a bit of coaxing, offers up scents of pear, apple, lime, a lovely base of chalky soil tones, almond and a gentle framing of vanillin oak. On the palate the wine is pure, full-bodied, long and crisp, with a fine core of fruit, lovely soil transparency, good balance and a long, vibrant and nascently complex finish. Give this a few years in the cellar. 2028-2045.

Savigny-les-Beaune 1er Cru “La Dominode” 2022

The 2022 la Dominode bottling from Marie-Laure Serrigny is an outstanding young wine. It's black fruity aromatic constellation is deep and ripe, offering up a mix of dark berries, espresso, pigeon, a fine base of dark soil tones, bitter chocolate, a nice touch of new oak and plenty of upper register smokiness. On the palate the wine is deep, full-bodied and closed today, with a rock solid core of fruit, ripe, firm tannins, fine soil signature and grip and a long, well balanced and properly youthful finish. This is going to be an outstanding wine in due course, but it is going to demand some patience. 2037-2085.

Savigny-les-Beaune 1er Cru “Les Peuillets” 2022

The 2022 Savigny-lès-Beaune “les Peuillets” from Domaine Serrigny is also quite black fruity in personality in this fine vintage. The wine delivers a refined and nascently complex bouquet of cassis, dark berries, woodsmoke, gamebird, coffee bean, a lovely combination of stony and dark soil tones and a deft framing of cedary oak. On the palate the wine is deep, full-bodied and structured, with lovely depth of black fruit at the core, fine soil undertow, ripe, buried tannins and a very long, well balanced and promising finish. This will demand as much time in the cellar as the 2022 Dominode here, but it will be equally stellar once it is finally ready to drink. 2037-2085.
