### **Allegro 2022**

*Ripe peach and apricot aromas with some nutty notes too. It's quite opulent in its honeysuckle and jasmine profile. Concentrated in flavour, with good weight on the palate. It's quite taut and oaky at present but should settle into itself. Notes of vanilla, ginger, blossom and exotic pineapple are tempered by a lift of salt and chalk on the finish. An accomplished wine that would be great with creamy risotto.*

### **Allegro 2021**

*I have been tasting this cuvée for over 12 years and it never disappoints. Honeysuckle and a breath of fresh jasmine followed by notes of lime tree, fresh lemon and a beautiful mélange of lavender and sage. The combination of altitude, 350-400 metres, schist and a cooler vintage give the acidity an even racier edge than usual and underpins a fine, persistent finish. The family fought to include Vermentino in the appellation for whites and so glad it did. 15% of the production at this estate is white when the appellation average is 4%. Still can't make enough. 2023-2027.*

### **Allegro 2019**

*The sunny, sharp, bright, green-and-gold smell of lime blossom with a deeper undertow of shortcrust pastry. Floral on the palate with the green minty lemon notes of verbena tea. Marked apricot-kernel bitterness on the finish. Tastes as if it is too young to drink right now. I'd cellar this at least a year.*
