

Domaine Paul Meunier Centernach, Roussillon



Côtes du Roussillon “Quartier Libre” 2020

Paul Meunier is from the family that owns Domaine Jean-Jacques Confuron in Vosne- Romanée, but his winemaking travels had taken him far from Burgundy (Lebanon and Australia) before he and his wife Lucile settled in Roussillon. Their Quartier Libre bottling is made from a blend of fifty percent Carignan, twenty percent each of Grenache and Syrah and ten percent Lledoner Pelut. The wine is fermented with native yeasts and raised in older Burgundy casks. The wine’s aromatic constellation is deep and complex, wafting from the glass in a mix of dark berries, grilled meats, pepper, garrigue, stony soil tones and a topnote of chicory. On the palate the wine is pure, full-bodied, focused and nicely transparent down to its foundation of soil, with a fine core of fruit, moderate tannins and lovely length and grip on the very well balanced finish...

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Paul Meunier vinifies this wine in the old cave at Centernach from grapes sourced from a number of sites in the Agly Valley, Lesquerde, St Paul and Maury. Great depth of dark black fruits, cherries, blueberries and plum. Smoky and delightful spicy finish with very fresh acidity and fine tannins to back it up.

A garrigue-brushed mulberry-dripping kiss of a wine. It’s so juicy it’s like a large, shiny-ripe, blue-bright round berry popping in your mouth. Like someone put a pin in a purple balloon. It’s sumptuous but playful. It’s fruit-flashing exuberance but not without a slender central nerve of black rock and the taste of thunder in the corners and smudge of grit in the easy-going, warm embrace of tannins.
