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### Condrieu “Jardin Suspendu” 2024

*The 2024 Condrieu Jardin Suspendu immediately shows just ripe apricot and white peach, spring blossom, pastry and ripe apple engravings. Midlevel-bodied and fresh-focused, the 2024 is tidily structured upon lifting vivacity, concluding with stone fruit driven persistence on the long finish that's accentuated by quietly woven saltiness.*

### Condrieu “Jardin Suspendu” 2023

*Pierre-Jean Villa's own version of 2023 Condrieu is also a svelte example at thirteen percent octane. The wine is made from a combination of young vines planted in 2009 and old vines from the 1970s. The wine is raised in a mix of older oak foudres and demi-muids, but with twenty five percent of the cuvée seeing its élevage done in clay jars. The wine's aromatic constellation wafts from the glass in a complex blend of pear, peach, papaya, acacia blossoms, a fine base of granite and just a whisper of influence from both the older oak and the clay vessels. On the palate the wine is deep, full-bodied and youthfully complex, with superb depth of fruit at the core, fine soil signature, zesty acids and a long, well-balanced and nicely precise finish. This is less generous out of the blocks than his children's version of Condrieu and would be happiest if given at least a few years in the cellar to blossom. Fine juice. 2028-2050.*

### Condrieu “Jardin Suspendu” 2022

*The 2022 Condrieu Jardin Suspendu is, as usual, a strong effort. Wafting from the glass with aromas of jasmine, white flowers, spring flowers and honeysuckle, it's medium to full-bodied, sappy and round with a rich, perfectly balanced core of fruit enhanced by subtle oaky notes and some freshness in the mid-palate, leading to a long, ethereal and racy finish. Crafted from vines planted on granite soils, this is a harmonious, clean wine.*

*Tasted blind. A slight creamy note on the nose behind white flowers and pear skin. A sense of sweetness on the palate, vanilla and custard with pear skin on the ripe, warm finish. Dense and powerful—yet just has a nice sense of energy as well to lift it. One for those who like powerful and rich Condrieu.*

*A strong burst of violets and peach comes out of the glass, then on the palate it's explosively flavoursome, a concentrated but fresh and intense Condrieu with intensity, huge length and massive amounts of pleasure. Great salinity, concentration and freshness suggests a long life. Fermented and matured in large, old oak barrels for 12 months.*
