Chablis 2023

The 2023 Chablis Village has a well-defined bouquet with touches of yellow plum and green apple. It's pretty and quite elegant in style. The palate is fresh and vibrant, with a keen thread of acidity. This is taut and demonstrates a little more energy and nervosité than its peers. The 2023 is very fine.

Chablis Mont de Milieu 1er Cru 2023

The vines were planted in 1935 and 1936 and are located higher up on the Chablis side. 25% wood. In this rough sample the wood is a little evident. Wood has tightened up the nose. Significant fruity weight here, really massive, though hard to judge the balance at the moment. Drink from 2028-2035.

5 stars/ 90-93 pts– Jasper Morris, Inside Burgundy, July 2024

The 2023 Chablis Mont de Milieu 1er Cru has a lifted bouquet that's well-defined, crisp and taut, with fine delineation and more mineralité than some of its peers. The palate is well balanced with a fine bead of acidity and citrus lemon commingling with orange pith. It segues into a harmonious finish with a persistent aftertaste. This is worth seeking out.

Chablis Mont de Milieu 1er Cru Vieilles Vignes 2023

Hand picked, no wood. The youngest vines are around 50 years old. Pale colour, delicious bouquet not too exaggerated. Perfumed but not exotic, with a good balanced finish between the fruit and the acidity, and certainly very persistent. Drink from 2027-2033.
