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### Langhe Barolo San Pietro 2022

*Lifted and pretty, this wine sits right at the rim of the glass with a teasing elegance that draws you in before it gives anything away. Juicy cherry and a savory slurry of spices that feel destined for a compote built for the dinner table rather than dessert set a genuinely intriguing scene. The palate is zippy and vibrant with bright red fruit before firm tannins take a confident hold and make the case clearly for cellaring. Drink from 2028*

*Bright ruby red with a subtly lighter rim. The nose is reserved, with hints of sealing wax, wet earth, and cherry. On the palate, it is full-bodied with substantial tannins, accompanied by a slight hint of iron and ripe berry fruit at its core; these flavors return in several layers but remain delicate on the finish.*

### Langhe Barolo San Pietro 2021

*Aromas of crushed red berries, dried orange peel and dried herbs, with mineral nuances adding complexity. It's dry, savory and lightly austere on the palate, with medium body and some spiced, tarry notes. Firm and structured. Try from 2028.*

*The estate's 1.1 ha vineyard in Bricco San Pietro is on its eastern edge, bordering Bussia. Plantings reach a cool 470m. The 2021 exhibits striking savoury fragrances of liquorice root, ginseng and forest flora. It is gracefully weighted with a dark currant core, tannins which are a touch angular and dry at the moment, and a roundedness and maturity of fruit which fills in the frame. It expands attractively in the glass and has lift in its step. Full props to this winery that has long chosen the lightest bottle option (450 grams) and its efforts to be sustainable at all levels of production.*

**94 pts**– Michela Morris, Decanter, January 2025

*Intense ruby red. Elegant notes of flowers and ripe fruit on the nose, followed by gently savoury hints of vanilla and cocoa. Broad and inviting on the palate with a pleasant sweetness, well-integrated tannins and a refreshing acidity, long and persistent finish.*
