Barolo Bussia 2022

There is a real joy to this, raspberry jam and strawberry compote tumbling together with fresh herbs, sweet spices and a cheeky hint of cola that makes the nose as fun as it is genuinely complex. The palate is plush and rounded with a juicy and irresistible energy that reminds you Barolo at its best should also simply be good fun.

A rich, luminous ruby red with a subtly lighter core. On the nose, elegant oak notes, accompanied by subtle earthy tones; ripe raspberry fruit, a hint of mint, and lingonberries round out the bouquet. Rich and full-bodied on the palate, with great complexity and depth from start to finish, tightly integrated tannins, a full-bodied wine with substance, remarkable length—it can and will age well.

Intense ruby red. The nose reveals an intense and complex bouquet with fruity notes of cherry and plum, complemented by savoury hints of tobacco. Rich and elegant on the palate with well-integrated tannins and a refreshing acidity, long and persistent on the finish.

Barolo Bussia 2018

The 2018 Barolo “Bussia” from Podere Ruggeri Corsini is a simply beautiful bottle in the making. The inherent elegance of this cru comes shining through in the 2018’s aromatic constellation of red and black cherries, anise, camphor, gamebird, woodsmoke, a superb base of soil, fresh oregano, a touch of cedar and a beautiful floral topnote redolent of rose petals. On the palate the wine is pure, full-bodied, focused and complex, with a beautiful core of fruit, lovely soil inflection, ripe, chewy tannins and great balance and grip on the long, refined and very promising finish. This is simply outstanding young Barolo! 2038-2100.
