

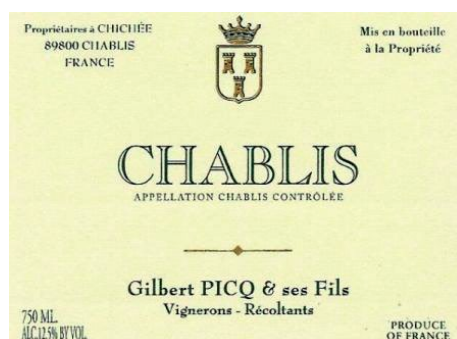
Gilbert Picq & ses Fils

Chablis



"The 2025s were racked in April," Didier Picq told me. "It was not a straightforward season. There was some rain that risked rot. I started the harvest on August 30, and at least the yields are good at 48 hl/ha." These are great wines, although they require time in bottle, which is why they often do not perform well at the annual Burgfest blind tasting. But I like the steeliness and verticality in these wines that do not necessarily come from the most propitious parcels. The Chablis Vosgros is a particular highlight, with the Chablis Vieilles Vignes and Vaudécorse punching above their weights.

Chablis 2025

The 2025 Chablis Village, which comes from Picq's 12 hectares, has a classically styled bouquet with green apple and pear scents, and a little sea spray. The palate is well balanced, with fine acidity, pretty sliced pear and nettle notes and a touch of bell pepper on the finish. Fine. 2027-2033.

Chablis Vaudécorse 2025

The 2025 Chablis Vaudécorse has a more floral nose than the Village, quite aromatic, with white peach mixed with honeysuckle scents. Fine delineation. The palate is well balanced with fine acidity and decent weight, with a little gooseberry, nettle and a pinch of white pepper on the finish. Drink over 8 to 10 years.

Chablis Vieilles Vignes 2025

The 2025 Chablis Vieilles Vignes has a well-defined bouquet with scents of yellow plum, fern and light chalk, cohering nicely in the glass. The palate is a little richer than the Vaudécorse, yet still well defined, gaining weight with a tangy, spicy finish that tempts you back for more. 2028-2038.

Chablis Dessus La Carrière 2025

The 2025 Chablis Au Dessus des Carrières comes across as quite closed on the nose and required more coaxing than the other cuvées. Light marine scents and oyster shell only reluctantly reveal themselves with time. The palate is well balanced with a fine bead of acidity, lime mingling with gooseberry and nettle, lending a lively finish that perhaps just lacks the sophistication of the Vieilles Vignes or Vaudécorse at the moment. 2028-2036.

Chablis Vauclaire 2025

The 2025 Chablis Vauclaire, which was nixed in the previous vintage, returns with a more malic, chalky nose that displays a soupçon more reduction than its fellow cuvées. It has a little more roundeur on the entry, with good weight, but there is an underlying salinity that comes through on the finish, flanked by a touch of white pepper. Drink over the next decade. 2027-2037.

Chablis 1er Cru Vosgros 2025

The 2025 Chablis Vosgros 1er Cru, picked at 50hl/ha, has an effervescent nose that blooms in the glass: clementine, blood orange and light white peach aromas, all very well defined. The palate is likewise very well defined, with intense citrus fruit and blood orange, very focused with a long tail on the sapid finish. Excellent. 2028-2050.

Chablis 1er Cru Vaucoupin 2025

The 2025 Chablis Vaucoupin 1er Cru was the one vineyard that suffered most during the August heatwave, according to winemaker Didier Picq, cropped at 29hl/ha, the same as in 2024. Maybe because of that, it just seems to lack the energy of the Vosgros at the moment. The palate is sapid on the entry, with a fine bead of acidity and good weight, quite conservative, and it just fades a little on the finish. 2027-2036.
